From our District Governor

Rotary International is governed by a President, Vice President, General Secretary, Treasurer and 17 Rotary International Directors.

In the Rotary world of 200+ countries and 1.4 million members, Rotary is divided into 34 Zones. Each RI Director is responsible for overseeing two Zones, often referred as "sister Zones.

Our RI Director is our very own PDG Drew Kessler from the North Rockland Rotary Club. We are in Zone 32, which comprises the northeast United States and Bermuda and has 22 Rotary Districts. Our sister Zone is #28 which is all of Canada, a part of Michigan, the state of Alaska and a small French island off eastern Canada.

This Zone has 20 Districts. The combined two Zones have 2219 Districts and just over 66,000 Rotarians. It's very fitting that with kids returning to school, September is Basic Education and Literacy (BEL) month.

This also happens to be one of Rotary's seven areas of focus.

Upcoming Guest Speaker: Sept. 28th Club Meeting

Steve Fine, president of the Melanoma Education Foundation, attended colleges in the Boston area, receiving a doctorate in chemistry from Northeastern University. He then moved to Pennsylvania, completing a year of postdoctoral research at Lehigh University. After 5 years as Assistant Professor of Chemistry at Lafayette College in Pennsylvania, he moved back to New England where he served in technical and management positions in high tech chemical companies.

In 1989 he started a consulting practice in the technology of high purity chemical manufacturing, concurrently serving for 3 years as Vice President of Technology for ACSI, a West Coast manufacturer of semiconductor chemicals. Shortly after his son, Dan, died of melanoma in 1998 at the age of 26, he founded the non-profit Melanoma Education Foundation and, since August of 2001, has devoted full time to the Foundation.

The primary activity of the Foundation is educating high school and middle school wellness teachers about melanoma skin cancer and providing them with free online lessons to educate their students about self-detecting melanoma while it is curable. At last count over 1700 schools in all 50 states were using the lessons.

Costa

In partnership with our Rhinebeck Rotary club we are going to the same place, participating in similar projects but going different weeks. So get ready we are going to the north western part of Costa Rica, to La Anita Rainforest Ranch.

"Nestled in a small valley between the Miravalles, Rincon de la Vieja, and Santa Maria Volcanoes, the ranch is surrounded by an incredible explosion of biodiversity; hidden amidst the dense rainforest live more species than are found in the United States and Canada combined... It is a pleasure to share with you our commitment to work in harmony our four pillars: Agriculture, Environment, Tourism and Community. We strongly believe that fair and comprehensive development of these brings a balance which at La Anita we believe it is our greatest responsibility. We mean to make this the most educational, relaxing and enjoyable portion of your visit to our country."







TENTATIVE SCHEDULE:

DAY 1:Fly from NYC to Daniel Oduber International Airport, where we will have a 2 hour drive to La Anita Rainforest Ranch. We will have a peaceful dinner and orientation to our week ahead.

Day 2: Build new classroom & community center (8AM-2PM), meet host families and have night off with host families

Day 3: Same Project (building classroom & community center)- 8AM-2PM. We are going to have an all group activity and then dinner at host families.

Day 4: Same Project (building classroom & community center)- 8AM-2PM. Afternoon Rainforest Adventure. Night off with host families.

Day 5: Same Project (building classroom & community center)- 8AM-2PM. The students and team will cook for our host families, and we will have a big community dinner.

Day 6: Travel 2 hours in the morning to the beach where we will do clean up with sea turtles and a conservation project. Spend night at hotel

Day 7: FUN DAY (part at the beach and activities around)

Day 8: Travel back home

Formal schedule, costs, and calendar of fundraisers are being worked out. More information to come.
